We hope you enjoyed the shortest month of the year! It is hard to believe that two months of 2026 are already gone! We are thankful for you and your prayers!

Throughout February, our studies centered on sharing our faith. Although many of the attendees do not yet have a personal testimony of salvation, this provided repeated opportunities to clearly present the gospel and explain how believers are called to live it out through both word and action. With Valentine’s Day in mind, on Sunday the 15th, we focused especially on Christ’s example of love and how we are to model that love to those around us.

We were encouraged by both returning and first-time visitors at the Fairfield service. A Cuban woman whom we had not seen for several months returned with her husband and son. She recently gave birth to a baby girl, and our group is collecting items to help this young family. Another lady was invited by a family member from the English service. She first attended with her daughter and then returned the following week with both her daughter and son. We are thankful for how the Lord continues to bring new contacts.

Early in the month, the Peruvian couple who began attending at the start of the year kindly offered to bring arroz con pollo (rice with chicken) to share after the morning service. This was a thoughtful gesture from people who have only been coming for a few weeks. We enjoyed not only the meal, but also the fellowship —and a little taste of Peru!

The ministry in Dayton is not progressing as we had hoped. The young couple attending has been inconsistent, and yet, at times they drive all the way to Fairfield for the Spanish service. Becca and I continue to encourage them and maintain weekly contact with them. Also, those who had been attending English classes are currently unable to do so because of work schedules. We are seeking to build new contacts, but deeper relationships have not yet developed. We greatly value your prayers for wisdom and clear direction as we consider future steps.

On the 14th, I had the opportunity to speak at the Valentine’s Banquet at Iglesia Bautista El Encuentro in Versailles, Kentucky. This church plant was started by our friends Todd and Rosalinda Marks, longtime missionaries to Arequipa. We enjoyed wonderful fellowship and a delicious three-course meal prepared by a chef from their congregation. The event brought together believers and unbelievers, young and old, singles and couples. I was thankful for the opportunity to share a message in both English and Spanish.

In Peru, Faith Baptist Church continues to welcome new attendees. Pastor Paul asks prayer for greater faithfulness and commitment among the members. They have also begun framing the stairway to the second level in preparation for pouring concrete. We praise the Lord for this continued progress!
